Section 4. First Aid Measures

Routes of Exposure:

If in Eyes Avoid contact with eyes. Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also

under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. If eye irritation persists: Get medical

advice/attention.

If on Skin Rinse skin with water/shower. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical advice/

attention.

If Swallowed Do not ingest. If ingested: If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Wash out

mouth with water. Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Stop if the exposed person feels sick as vomiting may be dangerous. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs.

Get medical attention if adverse health effects persist or are severe. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in

recovery position and get medical attention immediately.

If Inhaled Avoid breathing vapor or mist. If inhaled: In case of accident by inhalation,

remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest. If not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. Get medical attention if adverse health effects persist or are severe. If unconscious, place in recovery position and

get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway.

Section 6. Accidental Release Measures

Equipment and emergency procedures

No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Evacuate surrounding areas. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Shut off all ignition sources. No flares, smoking or flames in hazard area. Avoid breathing vapor or mist. Provide adequate ventilation. Wear appropriate respirator when ventilation is inadequate. Put on appropriate personal protective equipment as detailed in Section 8.

Environmental precautions

Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers. Inform the relevant authorities if the product has caused environmental pollution (sewers, waterways, soil or air).

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Stop leak if without risk. Move containers from spill area. Use spark-proof tools and explosion-proof equipment. Approach release from upwind. Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see Section 13).

Section 7. Handling and Storage

Precautions for safe handling:

- Read label before use.
- Do not ingest.



- Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing.
- Avoid breathing vapour or mist.
- Only use with adequate ventilation and is inadequate wear the appropriate ventilator.
- Do not enter storage areas and confined spaces unless adequately ventilated.
- Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames or hot surfaces. No smoking.
- Keep container tightly closed.
- Empty containers retain product residue and can be hazardous. Do not reuse container.
- Ground/bond container and receiving equipment.
- Use explosion-proof electrical, ventilating and lighting.
- Use only non-sparking tools.
- Take precautionary measures against static discharge.
- Eating, drinking and smoking should be prohibited in areas where this material is handled, stored and processed.
- Workers should wash hands and face before eating, drinking and smoking.
- Remove contaminated clothing and protective equipment before entering eating areas.
- Wear protective clothing as detailed in Section 8.

Precautions for safe storage:

- Store in a segregated and approved area.
- Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see Section 10) and food and drink.
- Eliminate all ignition sources.
- Separate from oxidizing materials.
- Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use.
- Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage.
- Do not store in unlabeled containers.
- Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination.
